NEW LOOK MEDICAL CENTRE TAKING SHAPE

To meet the increasing demand for GP based specialist clinics and services and in preparation for becoming a training practice from August this year

Appletree Medical Practice is carrying out a four-phase extension to its premises off Town Street, Duffield. "It is an exciting time of change. We have been in our current premises for 11 years and are rapidly outgrowing our existing facilities," said a Practice spokesperson.

The building work forms four main phases:

Phase 1: up to- May 2010

The car park has been extended to enable building work to progress without undue disruption to parking facilities.

A single storey extension at the back of the surgery will consist of new consulting rooms, providing valuable extra space to allow the accommodation of two trainee GP doctors as well as the existing services including physiotherapy, counselling, phlebotomy, midwifery, orthopaedic, and general surgery.



Phase 2: Up to May

A new centrally positioned entrance with automatic sliding doors will be created.

The new extension will be opened up with the wall being knocked through and reception will be repositioned onto the south side of the building.

Phase Three: May - July The

Phase Three: May - July The consulting rooms in the new extension will be ready for use.

This will enable the refurbishment of the nurse treatment rooms.

Phase Four

The existing plastic atrium roof will be replaced with a glass and slate roof.

A clinical store and sluice room will be created with an improved waiting area. The doctors would like to thank patients for their cooperation and whilst the building work takes place. The upheaval will be worthwhile, providing better facilities for all in the near

WELL INTO HER EIGHTIES, DAPHNE LILLEY CANNOT RESIST THI

It's almost twenty years now since her beloved husband, racehorse owner and trainer Claude Lilley died, but his widow Daphne retains her love of horses and the racing scene.

At the age of 87 Daphne has recently bought another yearling filly, named Ambala - a reminder to her of happy childhood days spent in India. "I am getting on a bit now, but I have never lost my passion for racehorses and it has given me plenty of highs and lows," she said at her Duffield Home. Daphne used to live on Duffield Bank the location of Claude's Milford Stud.

A well known sportsman
Claude was also a player and
President of Duffield Cricket
Club where Daphne has been
Patron for many years.
Claude's most famous horse
was Pretendre and Daphne,
long-standing ROA member
recalled the heartbreak of a
narrow Derby defeat.
In an interview with Tim
Richards in a recent edition of
Thoroughtbred Owner and
Breeder Daphne was asked:

What was your reaction after being beaten a whisker in the Derby when Pretendre, in the colours of your late husband Claude Lilley, went down by a neck to Charlottown in 1966?

I was very sorry indeed. If you are well beaten you are inclined to accept it more easily.

I realise that people in racing experience similar disappointments every day of the week, but to have been so narrowly beaten, and to know full well that you might have had a better chance of winning, was a bit of an ordeal.

Lester Piggott had expressed himself keen to ride Pretendre, but your trainer Sir Jack Jarvis remained loyal to his young stable jockey Paul Cook. Would Lester have made a difference?



Sam Armstrong (Lester's father-in-law) approached my husband after Pretendre had won the Observer Gold Cup to say Lester would like the ride. Naturally, my husband was only too happy to think that we would have Lester on board. After all, Pretendre was winter favourite for the Derby. I do think that if Lester had ridden him he would have won, as Lester always seemed to possess that magic trick. But, having said that, Paul Cook did ride him when he won the King Edward VII Stakes at Royal Ascot afterwards, so he did get some compensation for Epsom.

Jack Jarvis took such great care of our horse; he was so afraid he would be nobbled.

This was in the days before sophisticated burglar alarms. Before the Derby he fixed up a system with a fishing line between Pretendre's box and his bedroom, so if anyone had entered Pretendre's box during the night Jack would have been alerted.

Is it true you had to go to the cinema to see a replay of the Derby because there was so little television coverage in those days?

Yes

I remember it was on the newsreel.

We had to sit through the Chelsea Flower Show before they got to the Derby. It was then that it hit home how desperately close it had been.

We certainly saw more of the race in the cinema than we had in all the excitement on the racecourse.

There was consolation when you bred Snow Knight to win the 1974 Derby. Was it disappointing he wasn't carrying your colours?

It was in a way.

Every year we picked out what we thought were the best yearlings to go into training. We sold the rest.

When we decided to send this particular Firestreak colt to the sales, 'Mac' Nelson, trainer Peter Nelson's wife, who used to buy their yearlings, approached my husband to ask him what was wrong with the horse and why were we selling it.

My husband insisted there was nothing wrong and to prove it said if Mrs Nelson bought him he would be happy to keep a half share. She duly bought Snow Knight and we were very relaxed in the knowledge that we would have him in training with Peter, only to discover later that the new Canadian owner wanted to keep 100% of the horse for himself. So, yes, it was a shame, having come so close to retaining half of him, that we weren't partowners when he won the Derby.

How involved were you with pedigrees and the breeding when you and your husband owned Milford Stud?

In the days when my husband was disposing of older mares or buying new ones, Tattersalls did not include the progeny in their catalogues, so it was my job to research breeding records of the mares my husband was interested in.

I used to spend hours going through the stud books.

My husband started the stud in Derbyshire by buying the Aga Khan's cast-off mares in foal to stallions he would never have been able to afford, thereby acquiring some of the best bloodlines possible, going right back to Phalaris and Nearco.

Do you still study pedigrees?

Not really, because I am not as

au fait with the performances of modern stallions as I used to be. Since we sold the stud 20 years ago I haven't really had anything to do with the breeding side.

What is your involvement in racing these days?

Owning one horse and hoping it can do the best it can. And that responsibility currently rests with Convallaria, a six-year-old Cape Cross mare who was Geoff Wragg's last ever winner before he retired. She is now in training with Chris Wall.

I have certainly had some fun with her but I can afford to have only one horse in training at a time.

I do remember Jack Jarvis, with whom we trained for some 25 years, apologising to my husband for having to increase his training fees from £14 a week to £16!

In those days we would have about six horses in training.

What made you choose Chris Wall as trainer of Convallaria when Geoff Wragg retired?

Geoff recommended him. I have been to Chris's yard only twice since he took over Convallaria in November, as I sold my house in Newmarket and don't get there as often as I used to.

Do you still enjoy a day at the races?

I do, but not has much as I used to, because I can't walk very

I suppose you could say I am lazy, but how can one resist the excellent television coverage? I can see every meeting just sitting at home, though I do realise that is not very good business for the racecourses.

You are the longest serving member of the Racehorse **Owners Association. How**



long have you been a member?

I would say since 1947, when I married my husband, who had joined in 1945.

Why have you stayed with the ROA so long and what are the advantages of being a member?

I am a loyal person who doesn't chop and change.

I trained with the Wragg yard, first Harry and then his son Geoff, for 47 years, and if Geoff hadn't retired I'd still be with him.

Being a member of the ROA you receive a racecourse pass that enables you to go racing

every day, even though it might happen to be Ayr one day and Brighton the next.

There is also a camaraderie amongst members, which makes it fun.

As the years have gone by I think the ROA has successfully broadened its horizons and moved with the times.

You must have seen enormous changes in the sport. What, in your view, has been for the better?

That's debatable.

I'm sure one big advantage for trainers these days is being able to enter horses much closer to the race.

In earlier days they used to

have to enter three weeks in advance; now it is within days and in some of the big early closing races they can even make supplementary entries. At my age I tend to live in the past and I found racing in the past more enjoyable than I do today; you could move around more easily then. There weren't the seething crowds you get now.

And for the worse?

People walking through the enclosures with plastic mugs of beer is pretty unpleasant, you constantly find yourself in danger of having beer slopped all over you, even at Royal

I am afraid the changes at the new Ascot are for the worse. The new layout might attract more people to the races, but I don't like it.

Do you think the coverage of racing is good, on television and in the papers?

It is first class.

I watch most of the meetings and you always know they are all available on television. I particularly like Clare Balding, who acquitted herself so well presenting Royal Ascot this year after her operation.

Where do you get your biggest thrill from racing these days?

On television, particularly watching the Classics and, of course, a horse like Sea the Stars.

Daphne is getting good reports about her recently acquired filly Ambala from her trainer Chris Wall.

And maybe, just maybe, she will get some consolation for that heartbreaking, so close Derby defeat if Ambala could manage to win the Oaks. What a comeback that would be.



IAMAMOLE, LIVE IN A HOLE AND WORK LIKE HELL

Most people have no qualms about opening their fridge. Most people don't have cause to worry. Imagine my surprise one day when I opened it to find a little, shiny, black furry mole spreadeagled on a side plate – arms stretched out and its little pink nose just reaching the edge.

"The kids always bring me things!" was my (now retired) art teacher husband Dave's excuse and he was right – including a dead Jay and a Victorian stuffed fox. I admit I was intrigued by the mole as I had never really seen one close up before and only had childhood memories of Mole and Ratty from Wind in the Willows.

His coat was silky and soft and his pink front feet, splayed and clawed as they were, obviously equipped for digging.

The children were equally interested.

My next encounter was when we were camping. I was trying to sleep on my lilo which was resting on the thick, clear plastic sheet spread on the grass which formed the floor of the tent. When I lifted up my bed and shone my torch, the "tap!tap!tap!" that was keeping me awake was the pink snout of a mole hitting the plastic!

It was obviously having a hard time working out why the sky had suddenly become hard and was popping up above ground every now and then as he traversed the field. Not having a pristine lawn at home, I don't wage war but am still intrigued by these tiny mammals, whose molehills are all over the Millennium Meadow. Moles (Talpa europa) are usually between 12 -18 cm long and weigh between 60 -130gms.

Living mostly underground, they eat earthworms and insects using their very sharp teeth and find their prey by sensing its movement and smell via its almost naked pink nose and the hairs on its tail.

Their eyes can only detect light but their ears are holes covered in a thin layer of skin which provide excellent hearing.

The mole's broad head and cylindrical body are covered in special hair -each one thicker at the centre than the ends - which allows the animal to move freely in any direction along its underground tunnels. These tunnels are in several

These tunnels are in several layers with some near the surface and deeper ones for feeding and breeding.

They store food by biting earthworms to paralyse them or by decapitating them.

The large front feet are splayed with sharp claws for digging and it has small back legs similar to a mouse.

An individual can shift 4kg (10lbs) of earth in 20 minutes.

They sleep and work in four hour shifts and have to eat over half their body weight in prey per day to stay alive and to provide the energy to dig the average of 18m (20yds) of tunnel per day! Thanks to the structure of their bones and muscles a mole can project a lateral force when digging the equivalent of 32 times its own body weight.

They breed once per year and have a lifespan of about four years.

No wonder a collective term for moles is "a labour"! There are a number of superstitions around them. They were toasted by the Jacobites as "the little gentlemen in black velvet" because they brought about the death of their sworn enemy, King William. In February 1702 he was thrown from his horse whilst riding at Hampton Court after it stumbled over a molehill and the King subsequently died on March 8th. The present Queen has her own Mole Controller who traps moles by Royal Warrant at Sandringham. According to the old beliefs, he should carry a pair of mole's front feet in his pocket to ward off aches, pains and cramp or sprinkle mole's blood on his warts should he have any! So, unsightly, annoying, and sometimes dangerous,

molehills are evidence of a

healthy mole population and

a good indicator of plenty of

earthworms and good soil.

And they do work hard!!!

Individual Councillors are elected for a four year term and the next election will take place in May or June 2011.

Armed response officers were recently called to an incident with full firearms authority after reports of a man jumping out of bushes pointing a gun at a bus driver. The weapon turned out to be a plastic toy gun but the ramifications of the incident could have been very serious. On this occasion the offender was given a conditional discharge to write a letter of apology and attend a firearm seminar.

Crimestoppers: The police are urging people to report anyone they suspect is benefiting from criminal activity. In the coming weeks, Safer Neighbourhood teams throughout the county will distribute leaflets produced by Crimestoppers, calling on people to tell the national charity if they suspect that someone they know is involved in crime.

There are five leaflet designs appealing for information about criminals who profit by selling stolen goods, committing robbery, dealing drugs, carrying out burglaries or carrying out vehicle crime. Information given anonymously to Crimestoppers is passed to the police so they can build intelligence and take action.

Under the Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA), anyone who profits from crime can lose the financial and lifestyle gains they have enjoyed. For example, people who may have earned money by drug dealing can have this money taken from them with the money split between the Treasury, police, Court Services and the Crown Prosecution Service.

A spokesman for POCA,

stated that criminal lifestyles don't pay and anyone who profits from crime in Derbyshire runs the risk of losing the financial and lifestyle gains that they have enjoyed up until now. They may be drug dealers, burglars, fraudsters even shoplifters but by Valerie Thorpe 841945

Shed Security:

Also consider property marking items with your postcode and house number. There are security marking kits available at many DIY stores for this purpose or use gloss paint as an option. This may deter thieves as they want items they can sell on.
