CONCERN MOUNTS OVER GANG BEHAVIOUR

A plea to report anti-social behaviour to the police has been made by villagers who fear that Duffield is becoming plagued by the unacceptable behaviour of gangs of youths.

An increasing amount of grafitti is littering the village, cans and beer bottles are being left on places like Gray's Recreation Ground and Eyes Meadow, youngsters have been seen in file walking over the tops of cars, and people are feeling intimidated by the groups of youths swaggering around the village.

Complaints have been made to Duffield Parish Council and to the police in what is seen as a disturbing trend.

One of many letters observes "anti-social behaviour escalating around the streets of Duffield" and asks:

Are you concerned for your children who play on the park?

Have you seen loitering gangs of youths drinking around the streets?

Have you felt inimidated? Do you think it's right they should be allowed to do this? One letter to the editor says:



"I have spoken to several residents who have similar stories about gangs of youths, many of them under-age, drinking in the streets at all times of the day and night.

"Let's hope enough people complain to get something done about it...maybe a

drinking ban in the streets (it worked in Belper, why not here?)."

Villagers who witness any mob behaviour nuisance, grafitti spraying or antisocial incidents are encouraged to ring the Police on **0845 123 33 33**.


Seeking some relatives in Duffield



A great Book on Tape is not necessarily the same as a great







Division Mobile Police Office - Parish Rota

We are pleased to advise that the above rota has been reinstated in part, and the "A" Division Mobile Police Office will now visit Duffield on the mornings of the 25th August and 22nd September 2005.

The **Crime Figures** for Duffield in May 2005 totalled eight incidents, made up as follows: one theft, two burglaries, three criminal dam,age, one theft from vehicle and one vehicle damage.



Dog Control - the Parish Council intend to introduce dog control measures on Eyes Meadow and Millennium Meadow in new Byelaws that are currently being prepared. These measures may include the control of dogs on leads and the removal of dog faeces.

There has been no response to the Council's request for applicants Football / Changing Room Supervisors for the coming season at a rate of £5.65/hour. Please contact the **Clerk** or **Assistant Clerk** on the phone number below if you are interested in helping provide this valuable service.

The Parish Council wish to enlist residents' help in highlighting the very poor state of the **eastern Broadway Footpath between New Zealand Lane and Wirksworth Road** with the County Council Highway Authority at County Hall, Matlock (011629 580000), as all the efforts of the Parish Council seem to be falling on deaf ears.

The Parish Council has to report that Derby City Council have withdrawn their support for the **Duffield / Allestree Cycleway** provision on the A6.

The Parish Council wish to thank County Councillor Patrick Clarke for providing funding through the County Council for the erection of two new **Parish Council Notice Boards**, which are to be sited on Eyes Meadow and Gray Recreation Ground.

Inland Revenue Scam - the Police have been given warning of false Inland Revenue letters and forms being sent to employees at their home address in an attempt to obtain their personal bank details.

The letter has been created to give the impression that it is an official Inland Revenue correspondence from Fiona Delaney, Inspector of Taxes. It carries a false Inland Revenue logo and asks the individual th provide information concerning their residence status as "Not Ordinarily Resident in the U.K." *The Inland Revenue have confirmed that Fiona Delaney in now known to them.*

The letter encloses a form P86 which asks for personal Bank Account and Sort Code details and also asks the individual to provide details of his/her nationality, address, profession and date of birth. Please advise the local Police if you have been contacted in the above manner.

The Borough Council have confirmed that they cannot recycle **corrugated cardboard and envelopes** etc. that have a high glue content, and such items should be taken to the Cardboard Bank at Morrisons Supermarket in Belper.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE - TOGETHER

Derbyshire Constabulary is hoping that by highlighting the potential consequences of poor home security, the force can reduce the number of sneak-in burglaries.

The police point out that a third of all domestic burglaries in Derbyshire take place as a result of an insecure property or sneak-in and also emphasise that this could impact on insurance claims. Burglaries can have a huge impact on people's lives and yet by improving security, residents can help reduce the chance that they become victims of sneak-in crime in the future.

Assistant Chief Constable Mick Creedon said: "Burglary figures in Derbyshire are at their lowest rate in 15 years and yet last year 1600 burglaries may have been prevented had simple security measures been adopted.

"Traditionally the number of sneak-in burglaries increase during the summer months so we are urging people to be aware that open and unlocked doors and windows are easy targets for burglars.

"We want people to enjoy the warm weather and light evenings but remember if you are out in the garden or just in another part of your house make sure the rest of your home is secure - it only takes a matter of seconds for opportunists to sneak-in."

He added: "It is worth noting that the average value of items stolen in a burglary is more than £1,200 - a heavy cost when you consider in some cases it may be preventable by simply shutting a window."

To the first I do agree that they will not necessarily come out, but the incidents will be recorded and may be acted upon.

I am also informed of reported crimes (via the Belper



Neighbourhood Watch Support Office) and will highlight these to the police where necessary.

As regards the 'police are busy people' well it's their job.

If the police do not know that these crimes are happening they assume that all is well and I am weary of being told by the police that 'hardly anything happens in Duffield'!

I know that crimes affect different people in different ways but if it is of concern to you then it may well be of concern to others.

Let's try and make a difference together.
