"We are currently preparing a licence for occupation, after which building improvements commence. This will mark the beginning of a rolling refurbishment plan for the kitchen. disruption will be kept to the absolute minimum, but it will be



necessary to request certain users to accommodate storage or operational changes which we are confident will be accepted in good spirit, and in consideration of the future development of the centre. The time frame is to be confirmed, but we expect the council to be fully operational by October 07," said Richard. Continues page 4.

Swimming sessions are being held on Mondays to Fridays starting on August 6th and August 13th at the Ecclesbourne School Swimming Pool.


Cost £2 per swimmer each session.

The trust runs a day centre which caters for post retirement groups.

Many of the management committee and trustees are aged and find it increasingly difficult to deal with the paperwork and associated legal requirements for running the centre, due to the lack of able volunteers. Therefore the trustees are delighted to welcome the council as their presence will give the support and experience required in a modern society to run the centre properly. Without doubt, the centre will enjoy the added value of the council's expertise in the future.


The parish council will pay a rent to the trust and take over the telephone line, whilst maintaining the existing number, and pay phone.

The additional income will enable the centre to consider

employing a secretary or part time administrative help. Over the years the parish council has been of great help to the centre and has always been supportive of its work. This is an opportunity to ensure that the centre continues to function and meet its obligations, at the same time, providing a facility for the parishioners of Duffield and a place for retired members of the community to visit and enjoy.


It's hoped to have a regular development, up dates and articles of interest in the Duffield Scene over the coming months.

All the clearance work has been completed on the old Station Garage site in Duffield and by early next summer this artist's impression shows how the village will benefit from this Carter Construction development.

Building work started at the beginning of this month on the main foundations for a two phase development with Block A ready by Easter next year and Block B following shortly after.

Planning permission has been granted for 18 apartments, four duplex and two penthouses.

The Apartments are all two bedroom and include a large living/dining space, a separate kitchen, the two bedrooms (one suite) a main bathroom and a separate small third bedroom or study. The Duplex are on the end of each block with two bedrooms and en-suites and ground floor living accommodation.

The two Penthouses are described as "spacious and luxurious" with excellent views over Eyes Meadow.

Lifts will service the buildings along with stairways and there are 36 assigned car parking spaces, secure fencing and CCTV coverage.

The flooding of 1932 goes down in village history as the worst ever and we thought it was appropriate to let you know what



MEMORIAL INSPECTIONS AT DUFFIELD CEMETERY
PRESS RELEASE FROM THE HEALTH AND SAFETY EXECUTIVE:

Since Victorian times memorials have been erected at the head of graves as a permanent reminder of those buried within. Research has shown that the average length of time that relatives actively visit graves is only about 10 years.

It has wrongly been assumed that memorials are permanent structures that have been installed to the highest standards and will therefore last forever without any need for repair.

Unfortunately, this assumption has cost the lives of six people in the past 12 years, most of whom have been children, and there have been a countless number of accidents ranging from bruising to severe crush injuries and bone breakages.

Following research into memorial safety it is clear that cemetery managers now have to tackle years of neglect and poor workmanship, even though the memorials do not belong to us, they are still the property of the owner of the grave rights. Guidance has been issued from national bodies within the industry following the research and it indicates that cemetery managers have a responsibility, under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, to ensure that risks within their cemeteries are properly managed.

To do this they must inspect all the memorials in their cemeteries to ensure they withstand a reasonable pressure that may be applied by users of the cemetery should they slip and use the memorial to try and stabilise themselves for instance.

Approved methods for carrying out this test do exist and staff should be properly trained and use the correct equipment in order to identify the potential dangers of unstable memorials.

Some authorities have started this work in order to protect visitors to their cemeteries, only to find that the standards of workmanship often leave a lot to be desired, this can be particularly evident within newer sections of cemeteries where failure rates of between 35% and 95% have been regularly experienced.

In the vast majority of these failures poor workmanship can be clearly evidenced.

The Health and Safety Executive are concerned about this trend and now expect burial authorities to be inspecting memorials at least every 5 years and to be making safe any memorials that fail the inspection process.

Some cemeteries that have been found with high numbers of unsafe headstones in their cemeteries have had improvement notices placed on them by the HSE or have even been closed down until the cemetery has been made safe.

This seriously affects members of the public who wish to visit relatives buried in the cemetery and also those wishing to have funerals during a period of closure.

To make safe the memorials cemeteries are considering a range of options based on a proper risk assessment. This will include placing notices on memorials, setting memorials in the ground, temporary make safe systems, laying memorials down, barrier fencing each memorial or fencing/cordoning whole sections if the problem is severe enough.

Of course cemeteries try and advertise that they need to carry out this work, they place notices within the cemeteries and owners are advised when their memorial is found to be unsafe, where this is possible. When memorials have to be laid down or are fenced off for safety purposes, it is inevitable that some families will tend to become upset.

This work is costing millions of pounds throughout the UK and it creates a significant workload for cemetery managers, add to this the upset they know it may cause to be eaved families and this becomes a potentially huge problem area.

There is a temptation to ignore the problem, but someone could be killed or managers could be investigated and found guilty of criminal negligence. There is also the danger that the making safe of large numbers of dangerous memorials would cause a public outcry.

The manager is faced with a 'no win' situation, so must then consider the safety of visitors to the cemetery a priority.

If memorials are laid flat in the cemetery, if others are fenced or cordoned off, it is not because this is some contrived way for the burial authority to make money, quite the opposite this costs money.

Nor are they simply trying to upset families, this wouldn't make sense for dealing with an upset family is no fun for anyone. So why are cemeteries doing this?

To protect unsuspecting families that visit their memorials, sometimes only months after they have been installed, only to find that it is dangerous and could fall and injure someone.

The staff at the cemetery will be happy to help the public make memorials safe again if they have been found to be dangerous. Those advised that their memorial is unsafe should be thankful it has not hurt anyone.

Cemetery staff will always advise the public to use a qualified mason to re-erect memorials to the highest national standards, if this is ignored by the owner then they could be liable for any injury it causes. See local cemetery staff for more details, they are there to help and protect you. In the meantime, the public should be aware that cemeteries are potentially dangerous places, particularly if they have not yet been inspected.

Visitors to cemeteries should keep to footpaths, avoid touching any memorials and ensure their children are supervised at all times

As a response to the requirements detailed above, Duffield Parish Council have instructed an independent inspector to carry out the required testing on all memorials at Duffield Cemetery on Hazelwood Road, currently just over 700.

The inspection process will commence in October 2007 and all inspections are open to be viewed by the public.

PRESERVING YOUR IDENTITY WHILE ABROAD

I recently received some information about passports from the Belper Neighbourhood Watch Support Group which I thought would be useful to pass on.

If your passport is lost or stolen you must report it to the Identity and Passport Service (IPS) and also to your local Police Station. The crime reference number and details provided by the Police should be inserted into the relevant section of the declaration of loss/theft form (LS01) that should be completed and returned to the IPS in order to get a replacement passport. A few tips when going abroad:

Take two photocopies of your passport before you go.

Leave one with a relative or friend and take the other with you, keeping it separate from your original passport.

Keep your passport with you when travelling in either your hand luggage or a zipped pocket. Make sure you know where it is so you can produce it when you are asked for it.


Make sure you keep your passport safe when you arrive at your destination. If there is a safe or safety deposit box available, consider using it for your passport and other valuables.

Never surrender your passport to anyone who you have reason to believe is not official. Sometimes hotels will ask for your passport on check-in. If this is normal procedure according to your travel operator, make sure you collect it back at the earliest opportunity. If your passport is lost or stolen whilst you are abroad, report it to the local Police and get in touch with the British Consulate or Embassy for further advice.

The photocopy you can provide will help you get an emergency passport if necessary.

Valuables in cars: I recently received a telephone call from a lady whose car had been broken into twice in the space of a few weeks and items stolen.

Please do not leave anything on view in cars – not even in the foot well. Take things with you if possible otherwise lock them away in the boot. Even an old coat on the



back seat is a target for someone to 'smash and grab'.

He took 3 for 18 against Aston, but Duffield had


only managed 118 all out (Phil Jordan 34) and Aston at 119 for 7 had plenty of overs to spare.
