YOU NEED TO UPDATE YOUR SIGNATURE FOR PROXY VOTE

Amber Valley Borough Council will soon be sending forms to 3,500 postal voters asking them to update their signature if they want to vote again in the same way. Anyone who has a postal, proxy or postal proxy vote that is five years old or more will need to update their signatures if they want to vote by post or by proxy again. Signatures that are over five years old have to be updated every five years to prevent fraudulent practices relating to postal voting.

New forms will be sent to households at the end of January and voters need to return them in a prepaid envelope as soon as possible.

The Council's Electoral Registration Officer John

Grady said: "Anyone who votes by post or proxy needs to look out for this form on their doormat. It's imperative they fill it in and sign it so they can vote in the same way again at the next election. We'll send out reminders but we'd rather get returns after the first one as it will cost the taxpayer more to process. If the council doesn't receive signed forms by 13 March 2013, anyone with an existing absent voter status will have to be cancelled and they will have to vote in person at their polling station."

AWARD WINNING WINES PRODUCED IN DERBYSHIRE

It's one of those local fables that a vineyard exists in the north of Derbyshire. But this legend is in fact a reality, and a local man with connections to Duffield is the tenant manager of the historic **Renishaw** Hall vineyard in the very north of the county.


A vineyard was planted at Renishaw Hall in 1972 under the instruction of the late Sir Reresby Sitwell whose family has owned the hall for almost 400 years.

Today, Kieron Atkinson, a former Army captain in The Light Dragoons, who turns out to bat for friends at Duffield Cricket Club from time to time, produces Renishaw Hall's sparkling and still white wine, which last year won a national award.

Kieron the took over management of the vineyard in 2011 when the current owner Alexandra Sitwell was looking for someone to oversee the vineyard.

"I chose this career path a couple of years ago after my honeymoon spent in southern France and a chance visit to a vineyard out there" Kieron explains. "I'd made a decision to leave the Army after nine years' service and wanted to do something I'd find rewarding, which meant I could still work outdoors, but which also gave me a new skill, as well as reflecting my wife Jane's and my passion for travel and the cultures of different countries."

In December 2011, Kieron set up The English Wine Project, a consultancy - based website which supports the English wine industry and offers people skills in all areas of English wine, from vineyard establishment or wine education for catering



simply establishments, to knowing what to look for on the shelves of the supermarket.

"English wine isn't only for the select few or people with plenty of time - and money to spare" says Kieron. "I want everyone who wants to, to be able to enjoy English wine, from simply knowing what to look out for when you are buying or tasting wine, to

being able to grow your own grapes if you so wish."

The Derwent Valley Wind Band, as the community wind band for the area, provides a means for parents and children to enjoy learning and playing music together in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. Rehearsals are held each Monday evening (1845 – 2015hrs) at Ecclesbourne School, taken by David Curtiss who is a professional musician and teacher of many years experience.

There has always been strong involvement of children and teenagers; parents have been playing throughout, and in some cases are still going long after their children have left for university and careers. A good range of music is played; nothing too heavily formal, but a range from film themes, current and recent musicals, salsa/rock and light classics.

The pieces themselves vary in length from 3 to 10 minutes or so when played through, although these are played on sections at rehearsal so that adjustments and corrections can be made where required. Several concerts are played

during the year.

Some are large events, usually in support of a charity; others (mainly during the summer) are generally smaller for fetes, open days and carnivals (including Duffield).

In recent years larger events

have been covered, including Derbyshire County Show, Chatsworth House and Kedleston Hall.

The main concert of the year is given in Duffield just before Christmas, to give opportunity for members of the local community to hear what has been worked on and presented during the year.

It is always a lively affair with plenty of festive spirit and some audience participation.



The group meets on Tuesdays at 9.30am and Wednesdays at 6pm at Eyes Meadow.





TAKE TIME OUT TO WONDER AT THE BEAUTY SURROUNDING YOU

There are many things that can cause you to pause and catch your breath because are beautiful they or astonishing.

Maybe hearing the cry of a newborn baby, the beauty of a rose, the blueness of a sunlit winter sky, the perfect song of a thrush, the comfort of a glowing fire, the scent from sun-warmed hay, the melodiousness of your favourite singer, the colour of the tulips, taste of strawberries, the sadness of autumn, an embrace or a kiss and the hope of Spring.

When in а natural environment - your own back garden or on the Meadow - it pays to slow down and look. We often rush , our minds engaged in wondering what's for tea, whether there is time to go shopping, get to work, pick up the children, get home before it rains, afford to mend the car, make that phone call, go to the doctor, read the paper, mourn our lost youth, finish that painting, visit that friend, do the washing, afford that holiday, send that text or weed the path. We are propelled through our lives whilst all around us there are life and death struggles, survival stories and shows of exquisite beauty going unnoticed.

Take Springtails (Collembola) for instance.

They are the most abundant creatures on the earth, inhabit mostly damp environments and are found from pole to pole. Their remains have been found trapped in amber dated from 20 to 100 million years ago and in any cubic metre of soil there might be as many as 100,000 and up to 20 - 30 different species. Others are spread vertically from a tree's canopy, to the ground vegetation and plant litter.

They often spend their lives dealing with decaying matter and are the prime bio-agents responsible for the control and dissemination of soil micro

size is 1mm (0.04 inches)and they have the capacity to spring into the air up to 100mm (4 inches) Resembling small insects. they actually belong to a group called Cryptozoa the collective for name creatures as yet identified by science and often

organisms . The average

microscopic in size. You may, at this point, be finding this mildly interesting but are wondering why this would make you pause.

On the Meadow on a warm winter day, if you look closely at the patches of snow under the trees, you might see the Springtail Hypogastrura inivicola, more commonly known as the "Snow Flea". It is dark blue and survives the cold because its body contains sort of anti freeze that а contains high concentrations of glycene . Researchers are trying hard to produce this protein synthetically as it could be used for storing transplant organs; it prevents ice crystals forming in tissues and would increase the lifespan of an organ once outside of the body.

Whilst you are searching for this elusive tiny creature, you

might be lucky enough to see the smallest bird in Britain the Goldcrest

(Regulus

regulus). These tiny birds can be seen at this time of year in the copses (I saw two yesterday) as **Millennium Meadow** they rush about, up and down the trees and hanging from the ends of branches. They are looking for food hidden in the bark of

> the birch trees, in the pine needle litter or amongst the leaves of the oak trees - moth eggs, aphids, spiders and Springtails. The birds are very pretty with olive green upper parts, buff/cream underparts, black striped heads with a golden crest stripe down the middle(female) or an orange stripe(male).

> They only weigh about 6 gms (1/4 oz) and measure 9 cm (3 inches); if they are deprived or prevented from feeding, they can lose up to third of their body weight in twenty minutes and be dead within the hour. They have to find warm places to roost overnight.

> These little beauties are known as the "King of the birds" in European folklore because of their golden crest stripe and although

permanently resident here, often come over from Scandinavia in great numbers. One was recorded migrating in 1993 and being so hungry, it engaged with the biggest flying meal it come across, a dragonfly, and was towed along before letting go!

So next time you are out on the Meadow, pause, look, listen, examine what is at your feet, in the air, on the trunks of the trees; look at the fat buds on the ends of the branches all waiting for the winter to be over, the catkins hanging from the hazel branches already and the tiny crimson flowers waiting for their pollen. Listen to high pitched twittering of the long tailed tits, the "zi zizi-zi" of the Goldcrests, the cat like mewing of the buzzards, the insistent two note call of the Great Tit that sounds as though it is trying to blow up a pneumatic tyre with a squeaky pump and if you are lucky, the high pitched whistle of the Kingfisher as it flashes up the river.

If there is nothing that takes momentarily your breath away, gives you pause for thought or astonishes you with its beauty - go and wash the car, go to Morrisons, do the housework or better still come and do mine!

There was a poet who said something about this wasn't there? "What is this life if, full of care. We have no time to stand and stare " (William H. Davies)

WATCH OUT! THERE ARE ROGUE TRADERS ABOUT

Following the item about scam telephone calls in last month's Duffield Scene, I had a call from a Duffield resident about a scam call she had just received.

It was an 'urgent pension' call for which she would receive a payment of $\pounds 1000$ and to 'press 5'.

The lady rang the national specialist action fraud line and was told that if you do respond to the scam a higher rate call charge will be levied and the caller will then have your details for further fraud. *Please do be aware.*

Drop-in sessions:

On Tuesday 5th February PCSO Paula Bennett will be in the Mobile Police Station on Town Street between 10.00am - 11.00am and between 11.15 - 11.45 on Hazelwood Hill, Hazelwood. These sessions are for residents to visit with queries or problems or to obtain advice on things such as security or other issues that are of concern.

Rogue Traders: The police are warning people to beware of rogue traders following recent reports in the Derbyshire area.

A man offered to carry out repairs with some left over tarmac and £60 was agreed for the work but the man returned later and demanded a much higher sum of more than £5000.

In a similar incident a man claiming to be from the council offered to

There have also been reports of four men calling at homes to offer roofing and guttering repairs.

The police advice is don't accept work from strangers calling unannounced at your home or workplace. They may convince you to have work done that might not always be needed or you could end up paying high prices for low quality repairs. If you need work doing we would advise people to ask friends or neighbours for recommendations or to check a local trade directory, and ask for the names of people they have completed work for, so you can find out

about the quality and cost of the work.

Doorstep traders should legally provide a written form setting out a seven day cancellation period for goods or services over £35 bought as the result of an uninvited visit.

A trader commits a criminal offence if they fail to provide the written cancellation notice or if they make false claims about who they are or work for.
