FUTURE OF DUFFIELD HALL TO BE DECIDED SOON

The future of the old **Derbyshire Building** Society headquarters at **Duffield Hall should be** decided by Christmas. A short list of offers is

being analysed by owners Nationwide and their agents Colliers International. - a list which has been contained by the warning given to potential developers that the site is a high risk flood zone. Planning approval for housing on the site has been ruled out and there are further complications to would be developers

because the Hall itself is grade two star listed. The strong indications are

that there will be no changes to the main buildings on the site and the only practical use for them is as offices or similar commercial use, a training centre or a venue for educational purposes. Decision time is niigh but any late bids will be considered before the imminent closure deadline.


It would be preferable if the

NATIVE SLUGS IN DANGER FROM A SPANISH ARMADA

Sometimes it is hard to love all the creatures that can be found in nature. Some people hate the spiders which appear at this time of year looking for mates as we sit watching the T.V. . scuttling unpredictably on their eight legs across the floor and vanishing under the sofa; or those that disconcertingly drape a thread of anchoring web across the garden path just at face height. Other people can't handle things that are slimy and sticky such as slugs, snails and earthworms - all of which have been in abundance this year due to the wet conditions.

Not a problem for my grandson Ezra who, on a wet holiday in Wales, came on a slug hunt in the wet grass on the cliff top and ended "wearing" ten fat, slimy black slugs on the ends of his fingers and taking them back to the cottage to show his parents! Having admired them (and the bagful he had also collected) it came time to put them back outside and wash hands ready for dinner.

minute he experimenting and delighting in how sticky his fingers were and the next discovered the slime had swelled and stuck hard to his hands, refusing all efforts with soap and water to remove it! We soon realised that there was some special property of this mucus of which we knew little - namely that the wetter you got it, the more it became.(Tip of the week - wipe off most of the slime with a dry paper towel before trying to wash your hands).

Like all slugs, the large black and orange ones that frequent the mown paths on the Meadow rely on slime to move about and it is remarkable stuff, both acting as a lubricant and a glue. Slime coats the living body of a slug (which is largely composed of water anyway) and contains water, salts and small amounts of mucin carbohydrate protein molecule. As the slug pushes against the slime. slithers Millennium Meadow forward on the thin. Chair silvery mucus Di Hancock but if it slows down or stops, thick glue-like mucus takes over - hence the ability to climb up vertical surfaces without falling

off.

The slug packages the mucin in granules within its cells by coating them with a layer of cell membrane material. It releases them as necessary and these granules break open when in contact with water hence the need for slugs to be damp at all times. The polymer the mucus contains can absorb water up to one hundred times its original volume - a rate controlled according to the saltiness of the water - hence Ezra's vain attempts to wash it off!

This property links to one area of research about cystic fibrosis where there seems to be a connection between thick mucus and the defective transportation of the chloride ion.

structure is also a possible way of transporting

information. Scientists have discovered that the slime trail of a slug contains information to other slugs about its sexual direction of travel and where it has been and studying how the molecules share and pass on data, may well lead to a new era of super computers. If these properties can be harnessed, the data stored on a million CD's could be stored in something the size of a coin! However, there is one property of slug slime that you might not want to try. It acts as an analgesic and Native Americans traditionally used to use it to alleviate toothache because it effectively numbs the gum!

Slugs are around all year,

tucked away in damp piles of leaves, under logs and stones and hedgehogs, frogs and toads stock up their fat reserves for winter by eating them. Blackbirds and thrushes find them hard to manage as slugs contract their bodies and exude extra slime in an attempt to become unpalatable.

Even though slimy and unpleasant to the touch, slugs are a vital part of the ecosystem, eating rotting vegetation and even other slugs! Now the thirty U.K. species need to hold their against position marauding Spanish Stealth slug which has recently been accidentally imported in fruit and vegetables. This invader produces four times as many eggs in a season than the native ones and carries diseases and parasites against which the U.K. slugs have no defence. If we lose slug species, the natural ecosystem of plants will also suffer in the long run and there may well be an overall loss of biodiversity.

So, despite those much mourned, munched cabbages and lettuces in your garden, we might have to learn to love them a bit more!

Save our slugs!

A few tips to keep everyone safe:

- m m m m m m m m m m m don't buy fireworks from anywhere you're not sure about, such as a van or a temporary, unlicensed market stall
- m m m m m m m m m m only buy fireworks marked BS 7114 or with a CE mark this shows that the firework meets British or European safety standards (a reputable shop will know this)
- m m m m m m m m m m follow the instructions on each firework read them in daylight or by torchlight, never by a naked flame
- m m m m m m m m m make suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or rockets
- m m m m m m m m m m ensure only one person is responsible for letting off fireworks
- m m m m m m m m m don't drink alcohol if you are setting off fireworks
- m m m m m m m m

light fireworks at arm's length, using a taper

- m m m m m m m m m make sure everyone stands well back
- m m m m m m m m m m m never go back to a firework that has been lit even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode

Sparklers are fun, but always:

- m m m m m m m m m supervise children with sparklers and never give them to a child under five
- m m m m m m m m m m light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- m m m m m m m m m mut used sparklers hot end down into a bucket of sand or water

There is a ban on discharging fireworks between the hours of 2300 and 0700. This is part of a range of measures introduced by the government to ensure that people can still enjoy fireworks whilst clamping down on their antisocial use. The ban does not apply to events such as

Bonfire Night on 5 November which may continue until midnight and New Year's Eve which may continue until 1am.

Vehicle Security: police wish to remind people to consider vehicle security whenever it is left unattended. By taking a few simple steps your vehicle will be less attractive to opportunist thief; and they may save you a lot of time, trouble and cost having to sort out the after effects of becoming a victim of crime.

- m m m m m m m m m m Sat-Navs should be removed or left in a locked boot, together with its cradle when leaving the car. Any suction cup marks on the windscreen should be wiped away as their presence will indicate to the thief that you may have a sat-nav
- hidden in the glove compartment. You may not have, but this won't stop the thief from smashing a side window to take a look
- m m m m m m m m m m If you have to keep cash in your car, keep it in a closed ashtray or in some other out-of-sight compartment. If it is on view an opportunist thief may smash a side window, possibly worth £80, to steal £3.50 in change
- m m m m m m m m m mIt goes without saying that things like handbags, leather jackets, wallets, laptops, and shopping should never be left on view in the vehicle. Locked them in the boot or take them out of the vehicle completely
- m m m m m m m m m Registration documents and test certificates should be kept at home
- m m m m m m m m m Keep the inside of the vehicle tidy as an untidy vehicle



containing opened mail, plastic bags etc may attract the curiosity of a thief

- m m m m m m m m m Remove the facia of your sound system if it has one and use the PIN facility
- m m m m m m m m m m M Always close the windows and sunroof and lock the doors and set the immobiliser and alarm before leaving the vehicle, even for a minute, such as when paying for petrol at a service station
- m m m m m m m m m mIf your vehicle does not have an alarm consider having one fitted
- m m m m m m m m m When parking at home use the garage if you have one or park on a well-lit driveway or street
- m m m m m m m m m When parking away from home try to park in a place that is well lit and overlooked. When using a public car park try to use one that is supervised
