Megan and Benn set up a popup just over a year ago. It soon became clear that the people of Duffield wanted to buy plasticfree fruit and veg, and they opened their shop last year on 16th September.

"We are very happy to do something for the village," says Megan. "It's so good to see the community coming together to support Plastic Free Duffield." As well as buying fruit and veg you can take your own containers to their refill counter to buy a range of dried goods, for example, rice, pasta, lentils. Kale and Corn are also supporting local producers by selling bread from the Loaf at Crich, honey and eggs. So many plastic-free goods to try!

### SWIFTS, WASPS, MOLES, BLOSSOM AND FROGSPAWN

The sound of buzzing and the regular tap, tap, tap on the window pane was familiar and it did not take me long to spot the queen wasp that had been awoken by the strong sunshine coming through the glass - disturbing her long winter hibernation in the curtain tops. I let her out, hoping that the fine weather held.

It doesn't take long for the longer day length and the warmth to make a difference to the natural world. The blackthorn bushes look as though snow has fallen yet again as their white blossom lights up the edge of the pond against the black branches. Flies and early bees are visitors to this nectar source. Earthworms are abundant under the meadow areas and molehills are a good sign that their engineers have plenty to eat. Remarkedly resiliant, these seldom seen burrowers are part of the natural ecosystem that has established itself on the reserve.

The wetland is the most richly diverse habitat and the ponds were restocked with fish during the last flood. Full of minnows and small roach fry the main pond is proving to be the preferred dining spot for one of the local kingfishers. One of the smaller ponds is home to frogs and toads who lay their spawn once the days lengthen and the temperature warms.

These balls and strings of jelly containing the eggs nestle in amonst the roots of the bullrushes and fragmites - some will be eaten by fish, some by birds and some will be stranded before

hatches with changes in the water levels. Once the tad and toad poles are swimming they too will be at the mercv of predators like the heron who visits daily. Mallards have

already built their nest hidden away amongst the reeds and the pair can be seen preening and cleaning their feathers on the big pond. The startled call of the coot suggests competition for space. In amongst the reed tops the various warblers are already out singing each other and the small birds in the copses are calling loudly - goldfinches, bluetits, robins, goldfinches, siskins, great tits, long tailed tits with competing blackbirds trilling away.

Suddenly, there is a different sound.

A screaming that heralds the return of the swifts!

Looking up, these scimitar winged birds race across the sky as they return from Africa hoping to nest in same place as last year or at least to find a suitable hole in an old building, under the eaves of a north facing wall in a tall house. These wonderful birds have been in existance for over a million

- and once they crawl out of the nest they remain in flight without landing for 3 years. They eat, sleep and mate on the wing - "snoozing" one half of their brain at a time to remain airborn. They have short legs but very strong feet with which to cling onto the edge of a hole in a cliff or onto

the hole edge of a nestbox. Each foot has two sets of two toes, all facing sideways with which to grip.

Young birds do wing "press ups" in the nest to strengthen their muscles before they launch themselves into the air. Their parents will have fed them with balls of up to 1000 insects at a time.

Adults are long lived - 9 years on average - although one ringed one was recorded as 18 years old. This longevity contributes to their need to come back to a familiar nest site. Our need to repair our houses and the general decline in tall, old farm buildings has removed many usual useful holes lockdown saw a flurry of building repairs. There is a campaign to make new building have customised swift bricks incorporated in their design.

### THIS GIRL CAN... PLAY CRICKET

Clare Connor CBE, former English cricketer and captain, is a passionate advocate of the 'This Girl Can...Play Cricket' campaign and champions the role sport can play in driving equality. One of her objectives has been and continues to be the promotion of cricket as a fun. social game that women and girls can play with their friends and without fear of judgment. There's been a significant increase in the number of girls taking up cricket in recent years, mainly due to the rise in the visibility of the women's game. Television coverage has helped promote enjoyment and Bryan Henderson, Sky TV's director of cricket, described interest in the broadcaster's recent coverage of the 2023 ICC Women's T20 World Cup as 'healthy.' Duffield Cricket Club (DCC) founded in 1878, has a thriving girls and women's section and both girls and boys can play in a climate of dignity and respect. A softball team was introduced around three years ago and a hardball team in 2022, the first since 1935. This newly created team of eight players competed in the East Midlands Women's Cricket League and, as a result of their abilities and determination, won all the games they played finishing top of the league. A remarkable achievement! I hope their success continues with the newly-formed team for the 11-a-side league. This season the club will have some 30 girls regularly playing competitive cricket from April for junior and senior teams, and has justifiably been recognised by Derbyshire Cricket Foundation as supporting the biggest girls' participation in the county. Since the start of the year there has been support for the winter nets programme at Kirk Hallam Community Academy School which has kept players of all ages (from the DCC) occupied during the winter, and fostered opportunities for practising existing skills and learning new ones. I contacted keen adult cricketers, Kerry Mason and

Lucinda Holmes, to gain their responses of questions about women's cricket and the Duffield Cricket Club.

PW - Paul Wiggins LH - Lucinda Holmes KM - Kerry Mason

PW - Why do you play and enjoy cricket and prioritise time for this hobby over and above other interests?

LH - I have played many different sports over the years, but cricket has always been by far my favourite hobby. The fact that the game can come down to the last ball, and it does on many occasions makes this sport unpredictable and full of suspense. Regardless of what level of cricket you have watched or played, you will understand how the game can flip from agony to elation in a matter of minutes. Many of my friends who don't play cricket always ask, "who is winning?" and when I answer, "well no one in particular yet," their bemusement just shows me how much fun the game is and why I love the sport. Personally I always want to improve season after season and to ensure we have a women's team that is the envy throughout the county. Lastly, who doesn't love a sport that has food half way through the game?

PW - How would you 'sell' women's cricket and the Duffield Club to anyone with a desire to try a new activity, while being aware of self-development and life-long learning?

LH - There is definitely a new era for women's cricket and now is the time to get on board. There are so many more opportunities available to excel and progress to an international level than ever before and I am certain Duffield will see home grown talent playing for their country in future years. Our qualified coaches inspire the teams by helping develop the next generation's love of cricket, not only do they help protect the club's future



but make a difference in the community.

For anyone that has ever played at Eyes Meadow, you will know that whatever the weather you couldn't find a more picturesque setting in the heart of Derbyshire, and with the best facilities and committed volunteers, ensure the club is welcoming for family, friends and the opposition.

There are many transferable skills within cricket that can help with self development and even when forging a career; using strategy to win a game, leading successful teams on and off the field and mental strength to persevere through tough battles. With over 11 junior competitions and 7 senior teams across various formats of the sport, there is something for everyone.

If you would like to get involved and try a new hobby at a welcoming cricket club, get in touch.

PW - Are you seeing evidence that cricket is being promoted as a fun, social game that women and girls can play with their friends without fear of judgment? KM - Yes, since the England Women's team won the cricket World Cup in 2017, this has helped to raise the profile of female cricket. At club level, women and girls at Duffield Cricket Club are welcomed to play in mixed teams, in addition to all female teams.

PW - How would you like the Duffield Cricket Club to develop with reference to the opportunities for women and girls?

KM - Over the past couple of years, Duffield Cricket Club has gone from strength to strength with the formation of junior girls teams, alongside a women's softball team, and a women's hardball team. We are also extremely fortunate to have 2 dedicated qualified female coaches, to help and support the development of all our female players.

If the comments of 10 year old, Jessica Pipe, are representative of children and young people's interest in the DCC, then this augurs well for their future participation.
