SHAKEN, NOT STIRRED AT MOVIE SHAKES

Duffield milkshake bar Movie Shakes will soon have 2 new milkshake recipes on its movie-themed menu – thanks to enterprising pupils at Duffield Meadows Primary School.

As part of a cross-curricular project, pupils in the Year 3/4 classes at Meadows were asked to research a local business and then use what they had found out to create some marketing materials

about that business. Whilst one class looked at Pizza Express in Derby, the other two focused on local Duffield business Movie Shakes. After looking at features of information leaflets, they visited Movie Shakes to interview the staff and find out more about what they offer. They then drafted the content as a Literacy project before creating flyers using Microsoft Publisher and presenting them

to Movie Shakes.

As a second element, Movie Shakes also ran a competition asking the children to come up with ideas for new milkshakes with the two class winners to have their shakes added to the menu on an ongoing basis. The ideas had to be original but realistic with thought given to ingredients and they had to have a movie-themed name. The children then had to produce eye-catching hand-

drawn posters which could be presented to Movie Shakes for judging.

Movie Shakes were impressed by the breadth and originality of the children's ideas but, after careful deliberation, they were finally able to shortlist three entries from each class before selecting two overall winners to 'get their shakes on the menu' – 'Beauty and the Beast' (based on Cadbury Roses) and 'Wonder Woman'. The project was the brainchild of Year 3/4 teacher Mrs Cook who said: "It's fantastic when we can create a real buzz about learning by giving it a real-life purpose. The pupils have thoroughly enjoyed the project and developed their computing and literacy skills at the same time. It's also ideal when we can link our projects to the local community. Thank you to Movie Shakes for working with our school."



Reader's Letter

Dear Duffield Community
I am writing with Thanks to my neighbours and with a warning to the wider community.

On Wednesday 30th May My home in Duffield was Burgled. We live near to the Scout hut and we face onto the main A6. We have CCTV and an alarm system and the time was around 4pm approximately.

My husband and myself were out so there were no cars on the drive but my daughter was working in a front bedroom.

The Thieves were seen walking up and down the alleyway next to our property then entering our garden having climbed over the fence to walk around it checking in windows to see if anyone was in the house.

Following this they smashed the conservatory door with a brick then proceeded to run and jump the fence to wait to see if anyone was in or an alarm was triggered. All captured on CCTV. Unfortunately my daughter

did not hear any of this. They then climbed back over the fence to enter my home went straight upstairs and believing they were alone started to move through my bedroom, looking in drawers, wardrobes and my jewellery box as well as my husbands office. During this time my daughter was alerted to a disturbance and called the police.

They realised they were not alone and scarpered away back over the fence and to a nearby car.

This is where one of the thanks comes in. A neighbour nearby saw the car and took the registration number down which later was used by police to catch 2 men. So thank you for being so vigilant to strange going's on.

The police arrived extremely quickly, around 5 mins after my daughter called them and were kind, understanding, sympathetic and realistic. So my second thanks goes to them and to especially Tiff who was the reporting officer

and remained with us for most of the evening.

Another neighbour called to say that 2 men were seen hanging around bushes nearby matching the thieves description and from this another suspect was captured and although unrelated to our crime he was found to be involved in another incident which happened in Duffield that evening/afternoon.

So Thank you to those people who directly helped us that day and to the many friends and neighbours who have helped us clean up the mess and support us emotionally.

Apparently there is a spate of crime in Duffield and the nearby surrounding areas at present so be on your guard, put on your alarms, even if you are upstairs and just be more generally aware. We live in a nice, safe neighbourhood and we want it to stay that way.





THE CHANGING SEASONS ON THE MEADOW

Living adjacent to the A6 has mixed blessings. Peace and quiet is not usually one of them due to passing traffic, jackdaws and at times, noisy school kids! During the recent GCSE exams, the Ecclesbourne school children scurried past looking anxious, subdued and quiet – silently recounting last bits of vital revision in their heads. Those not involved sauntered along, taking as long as they dare - chattering and laughing as the summer holidays are near. Whilst we revel in the sunshine and the unseasonable temperatures, the kids have suffered in the exceptional heat - sitting still, frantically writing for two or three hours at a time in the middle of some of the highest pollen counts of the year.

Peace and quiet is not something the crows, jays, magpies and ravens enjoy either. As they try to steal eggs and young from other birds' nests the jackdaw patrols are on high alert to chase them off to protect their own young – all the while making their distinctive “jaak-jaak” call.

Jackdaws are

These sociable birds are the smallest of all the *corvidae*. Familiar to us as the ones that nest in our chimneys and noisily perched on

our TV aerials – they are distinguishable from other members of the crow family by their smaller size, light grey nape and neck and by their eyes that have a white iris. On the meadow they regularly chase off their cousins (and buzzards) and their flying skills are amazing to watch. They repeatedly fly up above the larger birds and in stall turns reminiscent of the best stunt plane pilots, dive - sometimes hitting their targets to distract them and make them fly away.

Jackdaws seem to expend extra energy when they take off to fly by flapping their wings but research in Lund (Sweden) has discovered that jackdaws' wing tip feathers spread out and so create lots of mini vortices to help with lift and this also helps to explain their acrobatic skills in the air.

They are very intelligent and social birds whether in an urban, farmland or woodland environment and they like to nest in colonies - feeding

and roosting together. Mating for life, they will fiercely defend their own nest made in an old tree, chimney pot or any other suitable cavity and jackdaws form strong pair bonds with their mates

- renowned for their devotion towards their partner. Even if they suffer from a few years of unsuccessful breeding, they still stay together, perhaps due to the fact that they will have invested so much time and energy into trying to raise young together.

Their diet is mostly composed of seeds, fruit and invertebrates augmented by pickings from road kill. They have been known to occasionally take other birds' eggs, which is why garden birds create such a noise whenever they are in the vicinity.

Renowned for being intelligent birds (a jackdaw was even trained to steal money from cash dispensers in Germany), members of the crow family have been widely studied by German neuroscientists Lena Veit and Andreas Nieder. In

tests, jackdaws were more successful than either bonobos or gorillas despite having a brain 70–94 times smaller, so the scientists looked carefully at the different brains.


The mammalian seat of reason is in our *prefrontal cortex*, a thin layer of nerve-riddled tissue on the outside of the front region of our brains. Birds have no prefrontal cortex (PFC). Instead, they have the *nidopallium caudolaterale* (NCL), which is located toward the middle of their brains.

It has been found that, when comparing human and bird intelligence, whilst we did not evolve from a common ancestor, we do share a portion of the brain called the *pallium*. Over the years this evolved independently from one another and produced *parallel evolution* amongst humans and birds. What their experiments suggested was that two dramatically different species might have similar *abstract reasoning abilities* – even if their brains are completely unlike each other. *If we imagine that intelligence can only dwell in a mammal-like brain, we may miss out on discovering smart life forms elsewhere. The crow brain may be the first truly alien intelligence we've been able to study.*

A curious thought to hold whilst watching these birds. So far, the annoyingly noisy jackdaw (and its cousins) represent the only verified intelligent creatures on earth capable of prediction, reason and imagination – other than mammals like us. Yet another reason to sit down the meadow - musing - whilst watching the jackdaws and all the other wonderful diverse creatures. Enjoy!

CROOTS FARM SHOP CO-OWNER APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF FARMA

The co-owner of one of Derbyshire's most popular farm shops has been appointed to the board of directors of FARMA, the trade association supporting farm retail.

Kay Croot, who runs Croots Farm Shop near Duffield with husband Steve, was voted into the position at the association's annual conference held at The Forest Pines Hotel and Golf Resort in North Lincolnshire. Kay hopes that her appointment will give a stronger voice to small and medium-sized farm shops across the country.

"Farm shops are a key sector in the UK, providing rural employment, ways for local producers to sell their products, diversification opportunities for farming families, and the chance for shoppers to reconnect with the sources of their food," said Kay. "FARMA is a not-for-profit association of the best real farm shops and real farmers' markets from across the UK.

Croots Farm Shop is based at Farnah House Farm, Wirksworth Road – the farm that Kay grew up on and which has been run by her parents Jim and Sue Yates since 1968.

They farm livestock and also breed Shire horses. She and husband Steve launched the farm shop ten years ago this summer – and it has gone from strength to strength, with an award-winning butchery, extensive deli, popular café and shelves stacked with quality local produce, as well as items from further afield. A former director of Boots, Kay joined the farm shop full-time in 2015 after spending more than 25 years in the

retail sector, working with brands like Boots, Asda and Aldi. She has been a buyer for Aldi, a central merchandising director as Asda, and more recently held several senior roles at Boots including commercial director for various departments.

"Croots Farm Shop is proud to stock items from more than 40 local producers, who are within a 50-mile radius, and to provide employment opportunities to more than 30 people," said Kay. "I'm hoping my appointment will help to raise the profile of small and medium-sized farm shops across the country and the role that they play in local economies and in supporting local food production."

DUFFIELD LIBRARY HAPPENINGS FOR JULY



I have been reading *Templar Silks* by Elizabeth Chadwick, the first time I read one of her novels. Set in England, France and Jerusalem at the time of Saladin and King Baldwin, this is a very good story. I've enjoyed it a great deal and will read the first in the series now!
