# THE ECCLESBOURNE

Ecclesbourne must solve safeguarding issues – but let's be careful what we wish for.

Like many of Duffield Scene's readers, I have an extremely personal connection with Ecclesbourne School. Not only did my children all attend the school, but I also served on the PTA, and I was Chair of Governors for many years, and chaired a campaign to save the school's sixth-form, which was what inspired me to enter national politics.

So, I was as shocked and saddened as anyone to read the headlines from the latest Ofsted report into Ecclesbourne. It revealed safeguarding concerns which automatically graded the school inadequate, despite the school achieving its strongest ever results this summer.

I have since been in touch with local Department for Education (DfE) and Ofsted officials, who have informed me that one option they are actively considering for Ecclesbourne to rectify these concerns is to join a large

'Multi-Academy Trust' (MAT). I firmly believe that this would be a bad move for Ecclesbourne and for the whole of Duffield and beyond. I was Chair of Governors when Ecclesbourne went Grant Maintained, a decision taken to escape the dead hand of an arms-length, poor local authority. However, at the very least, the local authority was democratically elected by local people. It would be even worse to join a MAT based in Derby, where the factors the school leadership must take into account, such as student outcomes, city centre safety, and many others are all completely different from the circumstances at Ecclesbourne. and furthermore there is no accountability to parents. The school's independent leadership and unique circumstances are some of the reasons for its academic success, and they must be preserved. The MAT could sack the entire senior management team and the school governors would be

extremely weakened because the MAT would be in charge.

Of course, the safeguarding concerns raised by Ofsted are incredibly serious, and I am pleased that the leadership of the school have recognised this and committed to resolving these issues immediately. Whilst I think it would be an overreaction to compel the school to join an unsuitable MAT, I do agree with Ofsted that learning from other schools about how to improve safeguarding is a good idea.

Therefore. Ι Ecclesbourne's provisional plan to operate a one-year partnership agreement, far short of a fully-fledged MAT, where Ecclesbourne's leadership remains in place but takes advice and best practice from a number of other schools. This seems a much more proportionate response to the concerns than fundamentally changing the governance of this incredibly successful school.

I fear that allowing the DfE to use this single Ofsted report

to force Ecclesbourne into an inappropriate MAT would lead to reduced academic performance and student outcomes, with consequential impacts on local house prices and on the community as a whole. It would be a classic example of throwing the baby out with the bathwater.

Therefore, we need to communicate the desires of the community to the DfE. If you have strong feelings about the school and a proposal to incorporate it into an unsuitable MAT, please do express these views to the DfE Regional Directors for the East Midlands, Kate Copley and Carol Gray, at the following address: RG.EM@eeducation.gov.uk

If the local community is unhappy with things as they are, they should and can currently get involved by standing for election to the governing body and therefore work from within. That is exactly what I did all those years ago.

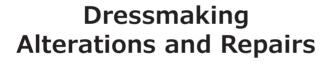

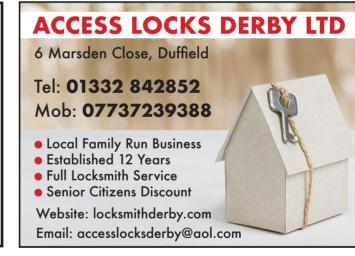

# I THINK AUTUMN IS MY FAVOURITE SEASON

The wonderful colours of the leaves on the trees, the bounty of fruit and nuts strewn upon the ground, the light of the sun throwing long, low shadows and the squirrels' antics as they stock up for winter. Autumn is also full of memories. Playing conkers with nuts collected by throwing a stick up into the tree to knock down the biggest ones; making bonfires in the garden with curls of smoke rising into the air; collecting cobwebs from the hedge with a piece of stick to play field hospitals; scrunching leaves underfoot; fabulous sunsets in the darkening skies - and home made soup.

These childhood adventures affect how we see the world as adults. When I was about 10 years old we went pony trekking during the summer holiday on Dartmoor with a group of pupils from Derby school - organised by my father.

One day we were trekking in single file along a small stream bed adjacent to a wall unaware of the beehives on the other side to which a steady flow of returning bees were flying. I suddenly found my long hair had a number of angry insects in it - one buzzing right next to my ear and which I had to remove with my bare hand. This experience rendered me frightened of flying insects (especially harmless moths!) for the next 30 years until we bred exotic, dinner plate sized silk moths at home.

My stomach flipped for a moment the other day when

I accidentally walked full tilt into a face height orb spider's web. Surprised by the strength of the threads, I was suddenly aware of something in my hair moving at cheek height and as I brushed the

spider from my hair, I was momentarily transported back in time. Many people have arachnophobia and find Autumn difficult we have our annual view of some of the 650 British spiders! The largest spider

found in the UK is the

Cardinal Spider (Tegenaria parietina). Male examples have been recorded with an impressive 12 cm leg span. By comparison the smallest species of 'Money spiders' (family Linyphiidae) have a leg span of little more than 2 mm. The name 'cardinal' was appropriated from a legend that dates back to the 14th century when Cardinal Wolsey was scared by the spider at Hampton Court. The spider is fairly rare, but is most commonly in the south of England.

It is often that large house spider with which people have a problem. These harmless but rather menacing-looking spiders are a real autumnal feature in the UK. They head out and about to mate at this time of year and can make for a rather startling combination of large, chunky, brown

bodies (from a centimetre up to 1.6mm) and unexpected bursts of speed - up to half a metre in a second! One of the fastest we have in this country, they prefer to live inside and often appear from

> under the sofa or bookcase running alarmingly quickly across living the room floor. You might also see them stranded in your bath tub. Across the countryside (and our gardens) we are treated to the

beautiful orb webs of a garden spider (*Araneus* diadematus) with its host in the centre waiting to catch a passing flying insect. These webs are often in hedges or suspended between two upright plants and can look spectacular when glistening with morning dew of frost.

The Walnut orb-weaver (*nuctenea umbratica*) spider can also be found near trees. Brown in colour with a lightly flattened body it spends daytime hidden in crevices in tree bark and emerges at night to spin its web.

While varying in colour - yellow, green, orange, red or brown - four spot orb spiders have visible spots on their abdomen. The females can reach up to 15mm in size which makes them one of the biggest spiders in the UK. They are usually found

in tall grasses, bushes and hedgerows. These spiders feed on small insects by catching them in a thick web.

One relatively recent and significant addition to our spider population is the Wasp spider (*Argiope bruennichi*). It has a very distinguished look, with black and yellow marks on its abdomen, resembling the pattern and colour of wasps and spins a common orb-web but with a single zig-zag pattern of silk running through the centre.

A common species that can be easily identified is the zebra spider (*salticus scenicus*) with its distinctive black and white 7mm long striped body. These do not spin webs but rely on ambushing insect prey by jumping on them. They can jump and impressive 14 times their own body length!

All these creatures trap insects to feed on and form part of the balance in nature. Most will kill their tiny prey with a venomous bite and wrap the bodies in silk.

Fortunately most spiders' fangs cannot penetrate human skin so we are unlikely to suffer if bitten - or only mildly. AND spiders will not attempt to bite unless they are frightened or in danger.Look and admire their architectural skill safe in the knowledge you are not in danger.

Enjoy Autumn - winter will be upon us no time.

#### Property Advice To Reduce Energy Use

- Maintain the building. A faulty gutter or high external ground levels can lead to damp walls in period homes, making them colder.
- Draught-proofing is one of the cheapest and easiest ways to save energy. Use heavy curtains or well fitted thermal roller blinds.
- Place caps on old, unused fireplaces. Chimney balloons are a cheap way to prevent cold downdrafts.
- Extra loft insulation is a quick way to greatly improve the energy efficiency of your house.
- Upgrade heating systems and controls – Intelligent thermostats or thermostatic

radiator valves control heating levels in different rooms.






## Duffield Remembrance Parade – 13th November 2022

The Remembrance Parade will still take place on November 13th and in 2022 this will begin at Eyes Meadow Changing Rooms at 10:30am and continue along Donald Hawley Way along to the War Memorial outside the church, with the Memorial service taking place at 10:55 – 11:15am and a church service to follow. Please be aware that Donald Hawley Way and Church Drive will be closed to traffic between approx. 10am and 11:30am to allow the Parade and Service to take place. If you are taking part in the Parade, please use the pedestrian entrance along Cockpit Lane (footpath alongside Appletree Medical Practice) to access the Meadow.



A note about the route change: We are aware that some residents have expressed dissatisfaction via social media with regards to the route change. This was a decision that was taken some time ago, after consultation with Scout and Guide leaders and other groups involved in the Parade. It was becoming impossible for the Parish Council to safely close all the various roads involved along the usual Town Street route, without support (especially after the loss of Jane Terry, our Parish Clerk, in August). This is a trial of a new route that is safer both for the young people involved, and for our staff who marshall the road closure. 
